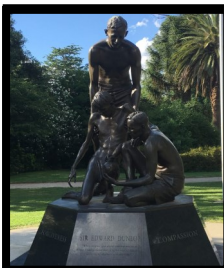

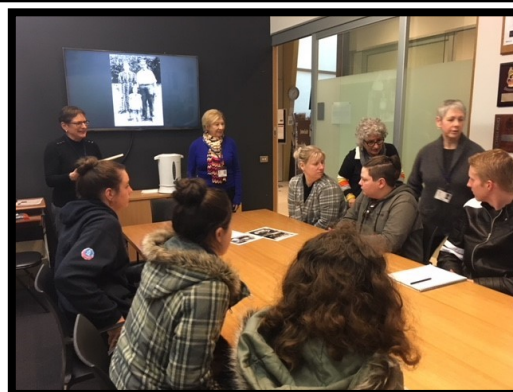
Student Review

Ava The Holocaust Survivor

My English class visited the Jewish Holocaust Museum in Melbourne. We met Ava who lived in Poland, in 1941. During WWII, her father urgently moved his family away from Poland because of the Germans. The family moved to Siberia, Russia. Unfortunately, her dad got taken away for manual labour. She used to go to the work camp that her dad was staying at and call out his name but he'd never come to the window. The conditions were very tough with the weather from -30°C to -40°C . After three hard years of hard living conditions the father reunited with the family. This story was very moving to me because I knew that the Holocaust was a very bad time. I learned that the Jews lost all their rights, and how easy it was for someone to do horrible things.

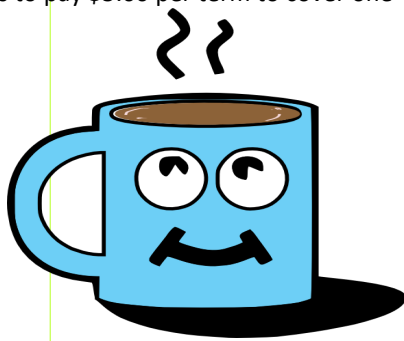

Student Accounts Viking Museum Excursion



We travelled by the school bus to the Melbourne Museum to see the Vikings exhibition. We spent about two hours looking at the exhibits and reading about Viking life. Viking children had many responsibilities from a young age. The word Viking was used to describe a situation or activity such as a trade trip or raid.
