Message from Roger

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2019.

The year has started well with student attendance at a very satisfactory level. Students have shown a great attitude towards their work and are applying themselves to the tasks set for them. It is hoped that all students will continue to show improvement and that they will continue to be involved in the activities that the Flexible Learning Centre offers them.

The first major activity for this term is the Australian Grand Prix excursion on the 15th March. There are 20 places available for students to attend the activity so I urge students to complete the excursion permission form as soon as they are made available from Friday 22nd February. We are in the process of getting lockers so that students can put their bags, etc. in a safe place – not in the classroom. Bags in the classroom are a trip hazard and we therefore want to remove this potential risk.

There will also be lockers specifically designed for the storage of mobile phones. It is the policy of Wodonga Senior Secondary College, as well as a strong recommendation from DET, that students' mobile phones should not be used or be switched on, inside classrooms. Therefore we will be asking students to secure their phones in the secure lockers when they arrive at the Flex. They can access their phones during breaks, but they must be returned to the locker prior to resuming classes.
