

Want to Learn a Musical Instrument or skill?


Wodonga Flexible Learning Centre offers lessons in most musical instruments. Talk to the following staff about adding something musical to your timetable.

John Beddoe – singing, piano/keyboard, guitar and many more






Careers Update Term 4

It has been a busy year for the Careers Education program at Wodonga Flexible Learning Centre, marked by diverse opportunities and significant achievements. We broadened our horizons with tertiary education tours at La Trobe University and Charles Sturt University, exposing students to the possibilities of higher education. Our participation in TAFE Taster days at Wodonga TAFE provided hands-on experiences in fields such as building and construction, hospitality, motor sports, and engineering, sparking interest in new career pathways. Beyond the classroom, students engaged in work experience across a variety of roles, from engineering to dog washing, gaining invaluable insights into different industries. These activities were further complemented by career expos, industry tours, and travel training to develop life-ready skills.

Our collaboration with Geared4Careers proved instrumental in preparing students for the workforce. Through tailored support in job readiness, resume writing, and interview preparation, many students secured their first jobs or advanced toward their career goals. Short courses in first aid, white card, and barista training equipped students with certifications that enhance employability and open doors to diverse opportunities. Additionally, we assisted students in applying for TAFE and university, ensuring they had the tools and confidence needed to take the next step in their educational journey.

The most rewarding aspect of this year has been the success of our students. An increasing number of Wodonga Flexible Learning Centre students are transitioning into employment, apprenticeships, traineeships, and further education at TAFE and university. These accomplishments are a testament to their hard work and the supportive environment we strive to create. Congratulations to our departing WFLC students and well done to all those who helped with their journey.





Students Explore Melbourne on Overnight Camp

The adventure began with a train journey into the heart of the city, sparking excitement as students caught glimpses of Melbourne's iconic skyline. For many, it was their first-time experiencing city life in such an immersive way.

A highlight of the camp was attending a production of *Peter and the Starcatcher*. 

Whether you're an experienced artist or a total beginner, you can get creative at our interactive drawing space and discover just how relaxing and enjoyable drawing can be.


Be inspired from the drawing prompt provided, or simply let your imagination run wild!





School Saving Bonus

System guide for parents and carers

How to use the online School Saving Bonus parent and carer online system

About the School Saving Bonus

The Victorian Government is making life a little bit easier for families by providing a one-off \$400 School Saving Bonus. This support will help cover the cost of school uniforms, textbooks, and school activities like camps, excursions and sports.

Receiving the School Saving Bonus

Parents and carers of government school students enrolled for 2025 will receive an email from the Department of Education from 26 November 2024.

The email will contain:

- your unique School Saving Bonus code to use the \$400 support
- a link to the <u>School Saving Bonus parent and carer online system.</u>


Parents and carers will receive one email and code for each eligible student in their family.

If you cannot locate the email, check your spam or junk folder.

Please note, the Department of Education and the Victorian Government will never ask you to provide your banking or financial details for the School Saving Bonus.
